## **Temple Beth El Welcomes New Executive Director**

"So this is my new best friend," says Laura Bernstein, referring to her car GPS. As a recent transplant to Charlotte, she is still getting used to our unusual traffic patterns. "I have yet to figure out how Rea Rd. runs parallel to Providence and then intersects it." But she's smiling, clearly pleased to be occupying the office of the Executive Director at Temple Beth

Laura, husband Howard, and daughter Sanya, moved to Charlotte in August of 2014, after 14 years of living in Des Moines, IA. "We needed a change, a new adventure," she explained.
