Long-term survivor succumbs to AIDS

LOS ANGELES—Michael Callen, 38,
died of AIDs complications on December 27, 1993 after battling the disease since his diagnosis in 1982. Callen was the former lead singer of "The Flirtations," featured in the Tom Hanks/Denzel Washington film, Philadelphia, and a prominent AIDS activ-

According to his lover, Richard Dworkin, Callen never took AZT and opted for alternative chemotherapy for AIDS-related cancer. He promoted the use of buyer's clubs for inexpensive access to AIDS treatments, urged usage of the term "people with AIDS" and advocated safer sex practices in the early stages of our understanding of the disease.

In addition to being an accomplished singer and composer, Callen wrote "Surviving AIDS," was a member of the New York City Mayor's Interagency Task Force on AIDS and the New York State AIDS Institute. He testified before state and congressional committees on numerous occasions and published several works on the disease.
