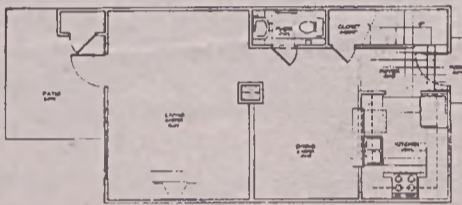

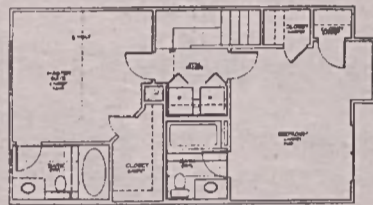

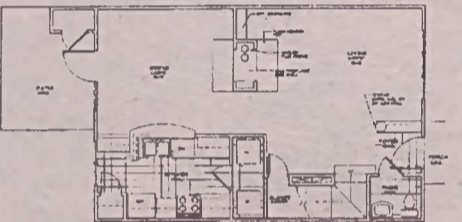

FIRST FLOOR

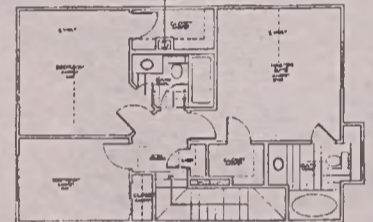


SECOND FLOOR

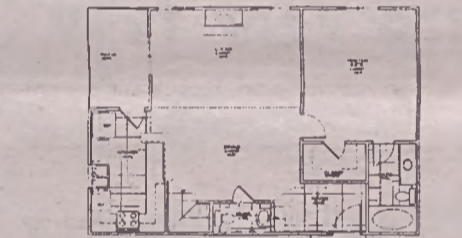

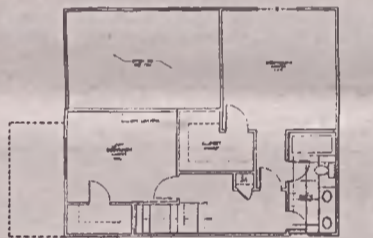
