Police said McKinney and Henderson met Shepard at a bar, told him they were gay, lured him into a pickup truck, robbed him, then drove him to a remote area and beat him into a coma. Shepard was found tied to a fence about 18 hours after the attack and died five days later from 18 blows to the head.

The subject of letters allegedly written by McKinney and released by Henderson's attorney, Wyatt Skaggs, came up repeatedly. At one point, Custis told Voigt he had not yet seen one of the letters, prompting Rerucha to bolt from his seat and say that he had witnesses who could attest otherwise. Two jailhouse letters were apparently written by McKinney to Henderson and the wife of another inmate, implicating himself. The letters, Rerucha said, were included in a package of information sent

trict 5 last year, and received endorsement from the Gay and Lesbian Victory Fund, but pulled out of the race after his mother was diagnosed with cancer.

He said he was also awaiting a transcription of a detailed statement recently made by Henderson (after his sentencing) and of a statement made by McKinney's girlfriend, Kristen Price, just prior to Henderson's plea hearing.

Custis said he requested Henderson's records because they were "absolutely essential" to the defense. "He is the only other person who was out there with Mr. McKinney so he's [probably] going to be a material witness," he said.

Voigt, who said he would rule on the requests later, has scheduled three days of hearings beginning May 10. ▼

"clarify" why "homosexual indoctrination of [first] graders is an acceptable topic to be funded by 'American Public Television' and Congress."

Also copied are Charlotte City Council member Tim Sellers (R-District 5) and Dr. D. James Kennedy of the the American Family Association, one of the anti-gay groups fighting the broadcast nationally.

In a letter of response, written the same day, Bouton states, "... Paul Neil, Vice Chairman of the WTVI Board...called me a few months ago asking about the status of this program. At the time our programming department had no knowledge of this program. I thought that strange because the information Paul had been given would lead one to believe this program was being fed as part of the PBS national sched-

He says that "upon investigation" it was learned that neither The Corporation for Public Broadcasting nor PBS were involved in the production of It's Elementary, that it is being made available by the presenting affiliate station KQED in San Francisco and that it is nationally distributed by an independent distributor of public television programs, American Program Service."


Lastly, Bouton confirms that the program will not be broadcast by the station: "WTVI has made no plans to place this independent production in our program schedule.

When contacted for more information, Bouton gave Q-Notes this terse response: "Our official position is in the letter. We have nothing more to say."


