publishing bans, Reverend Hawkes asked for anyone who had legal grounds to object to the forthcoming marriages to announce their objections. Having heard no objections based on law as outlined in the Ontario Marriage Act, Reverend Hawkes announced on December 24, 2000, that the double wedding would proceed.

Following the ceremony on Sunday, Reverend Hawkes issued a legal marriage certificate to both couples as provided for under Ontario Law. The marriage certificate was sent to the Registrar-General of the province of Ontario for registration as per the Ontario Marriage Act.

"MCC Toronto is proud to announce that we will be issuing marriage certificates for same sex weddings," said Hawkes. "Until now, we felt restricted from acting on our beliefs by what we thought was a legal impediment regarding same sex weddings. Being called by God to marry same sex couples we recently sought legal advice and as a result we have changed our position on the legality of same sex marriages. In keeping with the ancient Christian tradition of bans of marriage we will now be issuing marriage licenses for same sex weddings. We believe we will be the first to issue these licenses anywhere in the world." ▼

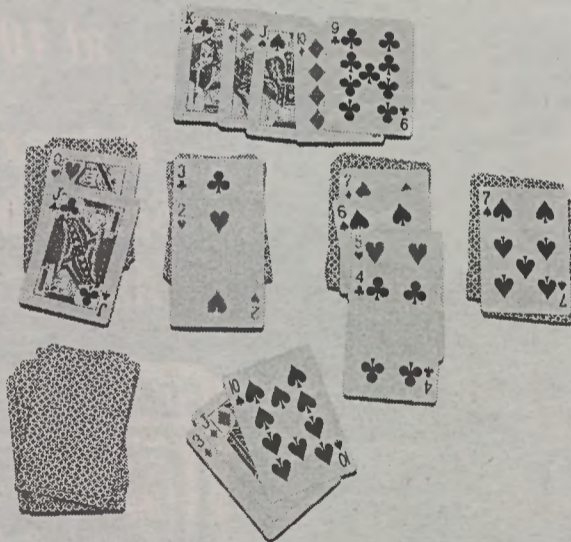
