## Support Senate Bill 847: Early Treatment for HIV

Current regulations do not allow the Medicaid program to pay for or provide services to people with HIV until they are diagnosed with AIDS, and are then defined as disabled and can get Medicaid. SB847, ETHA, introduced by Senator Hillary Rodham Clinton (D-NY) and Senator Gordon Smith (R-OR) would allow people with HiV to get Medicaid before they get AIDS and become too sick to work.

Treatment costs will decrease by providing therapeutics earlier; new HIV infections decrease due to lower viral loads; AIDS Drug Assistance Program will be able to provide care to more people; and most importantly, the quality of life for HIV + people will be improved.


