N.C. representatives sponsor anti-discrimination legislation

Equality NC secures introduction of bill to protect LGBT state employees

On April 14 Representatives Paul Luebke (D-Durham) and Larry Womble (D-

Forsyth) introduced a bill to expand the scope of the anti-discrimination provisions of the State Personnel Act, the law that protects state employees. The bill adds sexual orientation to the list of protected classes in the law, and defines sexual orientation to include protection on the basis of gender identity or expression.

Equality North Carolina (ENC) worked closely with Luebke and Womble to craft the language of the bill.

Along with Luebke and Womble, 22 other

representatives signed on as cosponsors. This represents the largest number of sponsors for a pro-LGBT bill in North Carolina history. ENC achieved this success by a combination of strong professional lobbying and grassroots action
