Election endorsements shared

STATEWIDE — As election time grows near, Equality NC (ENC) notes that there are a number of important judicial elections pending on Nov. 7. ENC-PAC is not endorsing candidates in judicial races this year due to refusal from those running to answer questions about

their positions

on LGBT issue. This should not stop voters

from being informed about those on the ballot. Recently, the State Board of Elections mailed a nonpartisan judicial voter guide to every registered voter in the state. Take the time to become familiar with those

candidates in these races and note their statements. Also, be aware of those who do endorse them to help make informed decisions regarding voting selections. For those who failed to receive one of the guides, visit the state's website to download one for viewing.

While not all candidates responded, the anti-gay, anti-equality NC Family Policy Council's voter guide (available at www.ncfamily.org) provides a revealing look at a number of the candidates. In addition to a number of other issues, it asks their positions on the right to privacy under Lawrence v. Texas and adoption by gay parents.

LGBT voters are reminded that One-Stop

Voting is still available until Nov. 4 in select counties. Check with local County Boards of Elections to find the location and hours of an early voting site near you. The mid-term elections are critical this time as many municipalities, states and the nation are considering legislation on equal rights for the LGBT community.

The same-sex marriage issue had cooled as of late, but with the recent New Jersey decision (see page 27 for more details) the Republican Party is using this to refuel antigay sentiment during this campaign period.

Meck-PAC has endorsed the following: Parks Helms, Jennifer Roberts, Wilhelmenia Rembert and Dumont Clarke in the commission race. Other candidates who received warnings are Kaye McGarry and Jim Puckett, along with Karen Bentley, Debbie Ware and Clarence Puckett.

Attorney Connie Vetter endorses the following in judicial elections: Chief Justice, Sarah Parker; Associate Justices, Mark D. Martin, Patricia Timmons-Goodson and Robin Hudson; North Carolina Court of Appeals, Seat 1, Robert C. "Bob" Hunter and Seat 2, Linda Stephens. THOMASVILLE -- On Oct. 16, the Thomasville City Council voted 5-1 in favor of a resolution in support of the anti-LGBT, antimarriage state constitutional amendment. Several ENC members spoke out against the resolution at the council meeting.
