and reported on the event. Spaulding met with several African-American legislators, many of whom were supportive of LGBT-inclusive legislation. A distant relative of Spaulding's, Rep. Sandra Spaulding Hughes (D-New Hanover) is a sponsor of the comprehensive sex ed bill, the Healthy Youth Act.

"She seemed quite progressive on many issues," Spaulding told *Q-Notes*. "She's definitely at the forefront of comprehensive sex ed."

In an April 2008 interview with *Q-Notes*, Hughes indicated her opposition to the antigay marriage amendment and her support of the School Violence Prevention Act. She's also

signed on as a sponsor of the bill to repeal the state's unconstitutional sodomy laws.

Ian Palmquist, EqualityNC executive director, said several legislators responded favorably to the Day of Action.

"The folks I talked to were really pleased to have constituents come in and talk to them, particularly the folks who had driven in from other parts of the state," he said.

Palmquist said the group will continue to promote the School Violence Prevention Act,

citing last session's near passage.

"We were unbelievably close last year," he said. "We believe we've picked up a couple of votes thus far, but everything can change day to day so I can't promise we have it all lined up. I want to make sure that we do everything to hold on to those votes because we know the right wing will be doing everything they can to chip away at that."

The group will hold two upcoming events discussing the School Violence Prevention Act and other issues, such as transgender policy. On April 7, EqualityNC will host a forum in Fayetteville. On April 16, a forum on the antibullying bill and transgender issues will be held in Asheville. For more information and to RSVP, visit www.equalitync.org.

Did you have a good time at high school prom? Were you there with the person you really wanted to be with?


