Douglas Lawrence Sheets, a former member of a white supremacist group, was found not guilty of three murder charges in connection with a gay-related shooting and firebombing. He was also acquirted of an arson charge and assault with intent to kill.

The jury in Sheets' trial deliberated for over five hours on May 26 before returning to Cleveland County Superior Court and announcing their verdict in the incident at a Shelby, N.C. adult bookstore more than two learness on which her

Sheets was originally charged with 16 counts. In the trial he faced five charges: three counts of first-degree murder, one count of arson and one count of assault with a deadly weapon.

As jurous returned to the courtroom, according to an Associated Press report (News & Observer, 5/27/89), several were crying. The families of the victims ran from the courtroom crying.
