

HOME SCENE IN THE COLORED VILLAGE

The present session was opened with doubled advantage. Another building has been opened and equipped for school use, due to the growing number of children—from 192, in 1918, to 388, the present enrollment. Eight teachers are employed, including a teacher of school music and a special teacher of industrial training for boys. The latter teacher is director of the community band, and is also organizing a school band. To crown the order of affairs connected with the colored school, we have what no other city school

in this State has—a Conservatory of Music, directed by four well-trained teachers of long experience.
