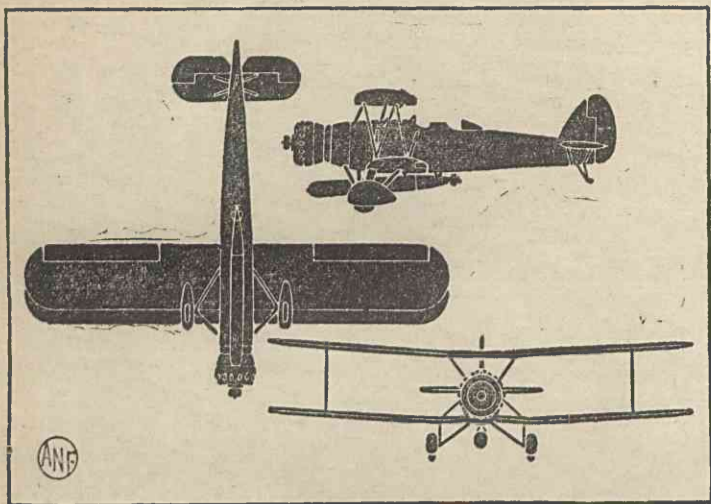


Know the Enemy's Planes

JAPANESE NAKAJIMA TORPEDO BOMBER



As the twenty-second in its series of enemy plane silhouettes, the Aeronautical Chamber of Commerce of America shows the Japanese Nakajima torpedo bomber, a three-place biplane powered by a 950 h.p. radial engine. The plane has fixed landing gear and slightly staggered wings with a noticeable dihedral. The wings and horizontal elements of the tail are untapered and have rounded tips. The maximum speed is under 160 miles per hour, which is low, even for a torpedo bomber.
