Ex-Prisoner of War Relates Experiences To Pre-Flight Cadets

First Lieutenant Horace Austin of the Army Air Forces who recently returned to the United States after escaping from a German prison camp, spoke before the Regiment of Cadets in Memorial Hall on Thursday morning.

Holder of the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters and the Purple Heart, Lieutenant Austin came to Chapel Hill to visit his younger brother, AvCad Robert M. Austin, a member of the newly arrived 42nd Battalion.

"I was flying a B-24 or Liberator when I was shot down and captured by the Italians," the young Lieutenant, who is only 22, told the cadets.

"We were on what we call a regular milk run. By that, I mean, we arrive at our target, dump our load, and return to our See EX-PRISONER, page 4
