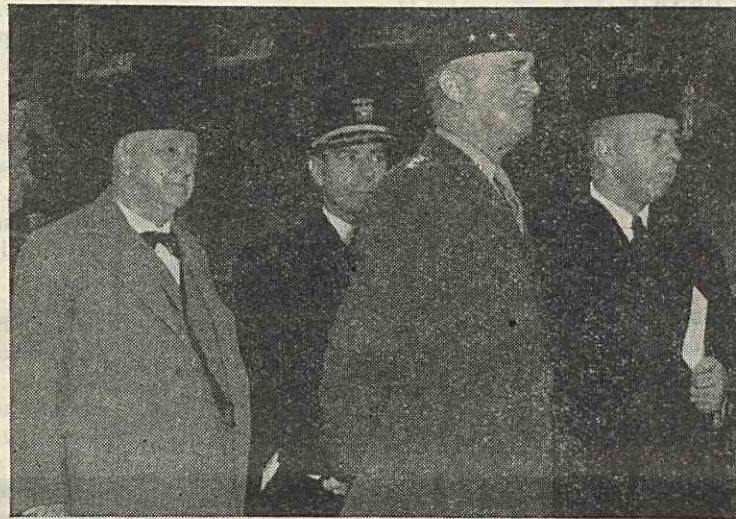
AP Rates 'Busters Second in Nation

The victory over Duke University last Saturday vaulted the Clodbusters into second place among the best college and service teams in the country, according to the first Associated Press football poll of the 1944 campaign.

Pacing the field was Notre Dame—the 1943 mythical national champion—with 800 points and 34 first place votes. The Clodbusters were credited with 608 points and 24 first place nominations. Completing the first five were Army, Randolph Field, and Great Lakes, in that order.

In the Williamson ratings issued last week, the Clodbusters held down the third spot among the service teams with a mark of 93.3. Randolph Field was tops with 99.9 and Great Lakes second with 97.2.

Clodbusters Seek Fourth Straight Today at Virginia

This afternoon at 1500 the Clodbusters will be seeking their fourth straight victory—this time against the University of Virginia at Charlottesville.

Led by Cadet Wally Schumacher, who will be starting at left end and who will be acting as team captain, the Clodbusters will be heavy favorites. However, it might be well to mention that the Cavaliers have one of the better college teams in the South, and they'll be out to upset the highly rated Pre-Flighters.

Scouting reports on the Virginia team have caused Clodbuster coaches much concern. Throughout the past week the "B" team scrimmaged against the varsity using Virginia plays. They had uncanny luck throughout, especially on passing.

Likely to start for Virginia will be Ward Speer and Hank Walker at the ends, Joe Kirkland and Rufus Roberts at the tackles, Bruce Wood and John Meador at the guards, and Buck Palmer at center.

Allen Clay, Charlie Ellis and Joe McCary will all take turns calling signals for the varsity, while Lucien Burnett and Whitey Michels will alternate at fullback. Halfback standouts include John Duda, Dick Davis, Frank Goodman, and Clyde Johnson.

Several changes have been made in the Clodbuster starting lineup. Walter Schumacher will start at left end in place of War— See *FOOTBALL*, page 4
