Paced by Lieut. Charles Beetham, winner of the 1945 Millrose half-mile and head coach of the track squad, the Cloudbusters compiled 39 3/7 points to nose out the Cherry Point Marines, who had 35 3/7. In order followed UNC, with 34 6/7; Duke, 11 3/7, and Virginia, with four points

Lieut. Beetham won the 440 despite being boxed at the outset and, in addition, the former Ohio State speedster put Pre-Flight in front by coming from behind in the sprint medley relay to win in the meet record time of 3:45.1. In the mile re-lay, Lieut. Beetham's team was

again a winner.
