4. Do you know that it costs more than a drilled well?
5. That the digging of it disfigures your yard?
6. That on account of the water it is hardly ever sunk beyond the first surface stream?
7. And that, therefore, it usually goes dry at the very time of the year you need water most.
8. Do you know that a drilled well 6 inches in diameter will afford as much water as a dug well 6 feet in diameter?
