215 High School Seniors Applied

College scholarships which will cover the normal period of four years of higher education, have been won by 21 Firestone employees' sons and daughters in 10 states. The announcement was released by Harvey S. Firestone, Jr., Chairman of the Company.

This brings to 63 the number of students across the country who have won Firestone college scholarships in the three years since the program was adopted.

One high school senior in the Gastonia area received a scholarship award. He was Bobby E. Sellers of Bessemer City.

THE COMPANY scholarships provide for full tuition at the school of the winner's choice, academic fees, textbooks and a contribution toward the cost of living while in school. They are renewable annually until requirements for an academic degree are fulfilled, providing satisfactory scholastic standings are maintained and all other qualifications are met.

Because of the extreme closeness in the scoring of the leading applicants, the Scholarship Board of the Company decided to award six more scholarships this year than has been the custom. Only 15 annual Firestone scholarship awards were announced as available when the program was started in 1953.

THIS YEAR a total of 215 high school seniors applied for Firestone scholarships. In selecting the best qualified students for the awards, a group of impartial judges carefully reviewed all applications.

The scholarships are allocated to various sections of the country on the basis of proportionate Firestone employment. This assures that children of all employees have equal opportunity to win one of the college education scholarships without respect to where they may live.
