Fall is here and vacations are almost at an end for most of us. Jack is still on his vacation in Minnesota, fishing in the tall timbers.

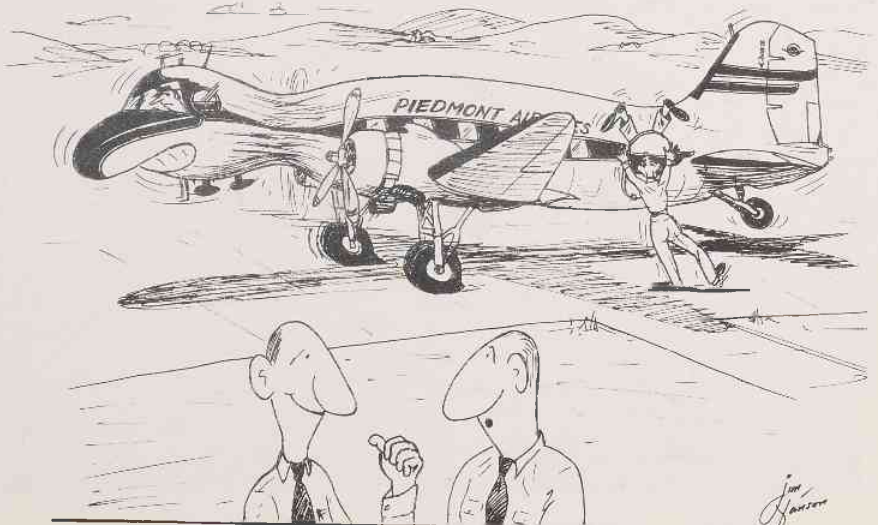
