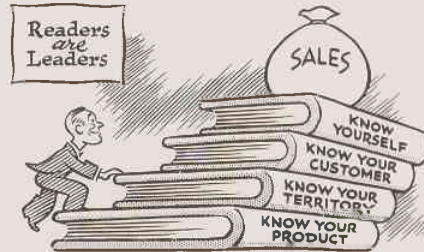

## VACATION TIPS

Last month we went south and east, so let's head the other way. Hop on TWA to Albuquerque, Frontier to Flagstaff, then by surface transportation to Zion National Park, Bryce Canyon, and the Grand Canyon. The only way to see this magnificent country is by car, so pick up a rental car in Flagstaff. If you want to save a little loot, go to Cedar City, Utah, and take one of the all-expense paid bus tours, which, incidentally, are complete and comfortable, all in air-conditioned buses. Five-day trip runs about \$75.00. Or, if you'd rather drive yourself, excellent accommodations are to be had at either of the three parks for \$6.50 per day per couple, plus meals. If you really

want to live it up, try one of the deluxe guest lodges. There are lots of escorted horseback trips available to points of interest for about \$7.50 per day. Tip: Take warm clothes. Temperature is likely to change rapidly at 8-9000 feet.

For the trip you'll never forget, take TWA and Continental to Denver, Frontier to Cody, Wyoming, surface transportation to Yellowstone National Park. Take it from me, there's no place in the world like it. Accommodations at Yellowstone are on a par with those at the Arizona-Utah parks, and about the same price. In Yellowstone, be sure to take one of the long horseback pack trips, and, for goodness sake, take your camera and lots of color film. Fishing is terrific, but hunting is prohibited, except in certain periods of the year. Don't be afraid of the bears - they've seen lots of people. Just don't feed them. If you have time, a trip to the park at Jackson Hole, Wyoming, is well worth the trouble. You've never seen any better fishing or more game. Have fun, kiddies!

## WATCH THAT SUNBURN!

The time of year for blistered backs has come around again, and with it the usual crop of lost manhours. In one department employing about 60 people, over 130 man-hours were lost last year, due to excessive sunburn. Follow these simple rules, and let's cut down the loss.

<u>Coloring</u>	<u>Initial Exposure</u>
Brunette	35 minutes
Brownette	30 minutes
Blonde	25 minutes
Redhead	20 minutes

If you can get your sun in two doses a day, your tan will be more even.

Use a good suntan oil, and if you're in a big hurry for that tan, use an oil containing iodine.
