

FISHING TRIP

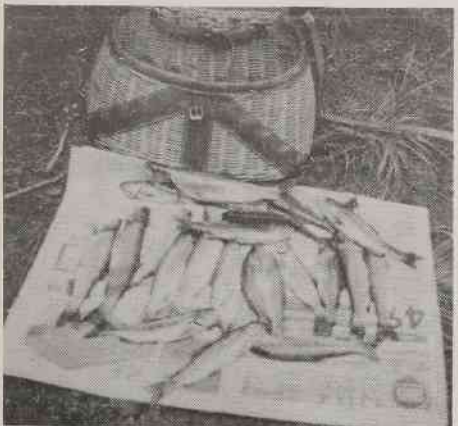
The latter part of May a group of men whom we all know, went up to Noland's Creek for a couple of day's fishing and from the pictures it would seem that they were very successful in their mission.
