One of the smallest but very important departments of Piedmont Airlines is Shipping and Receiving. A. H. Burton, a veteran of nine years with Piedmont is Chief Clerk and is ably assisted by Dick Coudle, and Cliff Pitts.

An average day finds these men at work sorting COMAT and U. S. Mail for distribution to various departments. They handle all orders for outside stations, including maintenance parts, advertising and station supplies. The outgoing freight averages 1,000 pounds per day.

Incoming freight, which ranges up to 3500 pounds per day, is inspected and delivered. Records are kept on all outside maintenance inventory.

In the course of one year, over 15,000 different items are received by this Department. If all the 55-gallon drums received last year were placed end to end, they would reach twice the height of the Washington Monument.

The tremendous amount of work performed by Shipping and Receiving and the efficient manner in which it is handled makes this Department a very important part of Piedmont's operation.

The wise carry their knowledge as they do their watches, not for display, but for their own use.
