

WILLARD RECEIVES 15 YEAR PIN

D.R. "Red" Willurd, Supt. of the Engine Shop, Fixed Base Division, was presented with a service pin signifying the completion of fifteen years of service on April 14.

Red Willard started as a mechanic's helper and after completing his apprenticeship in fourteen months, obtained an A & E license. Shortly afterwards, he was transferred to Greensboro to manage the maintenance shop for the Indoctrination Course for Air Force Trainees. He returned to Winston-Salem in 1944 and began to set up the engine shop facilities for Piedmont. In reminiscing, "Red" recalls that his complement of shop ear ment consisted of two carpenter's saw hacks, a plank and miscellaneous hand tools. By early 1947, the shop was equipped to handle any type small aircraft engine and in addition thereto, had complete machine shop facilities available to accommodate the small airport operators in the Piedmont area.

When the Airline Division was formed in 1947, the job of overhauling the larger engines presented itself and the successful program that followed is attributable in a large part, to his outstanding devotion to duty and the tremendous effort he exerted to overcome the many obstacles.

Red Willard holds the official CAA designation of Aircraft Inspector and Aircraft Mechanic Examiner in addition to being a licensed private pilot.
