The primary function of the new group will be to promote more efficient hangar and shop operation through control of work scheduling, forecasting manpower requirements, planning customer work loads, coordinating aircraft parts availability and scheduling with each job and liaison with engineering.

Production Control will consist of four subsections. They are Airline Aircraft Planning, Customer Planning, Equipment Control and a Records Section.

Other promotions which have been made include J. W. "Bill" Johnson, who was named Supervisor of Customer Planning and F. L. Sfreddo who was promoted from Inspector to Engineering Liaison.

BOOKLET FOR QUICKLY FIGURING FAMILY FARES

A new 20-page handbook for speedy calculation of fares under the Family Fare Plan is being distributed to all reservations and ticketing positions.

The booklet is sponsored by the Avis Rent-A-Car System.

By referring to the cost of one-way or round trip air fare, the accurate family fare for the same route can be figured.

Every fare from \$3.50 to \$200 is listed in five cent steps. Along with the basic one-way fare, the booklet shows family plan fares (including the 10 per cent transportation tax) for two, three and four persons, both one-way and round trip.

The Family Fare Plan was devised to stimulate mid-week ticket sales by offering reduced charges for a family party traveling at the same time.
