Christmas Party

The 1969 World Airlines Christmas Party will be held at Hotel Sahara in Las Vegas December 1-14 with more than 10,000 airline employees expected to attend. A wider range of activities and greater participation by Hotel Sahara are planned in a number of areas.

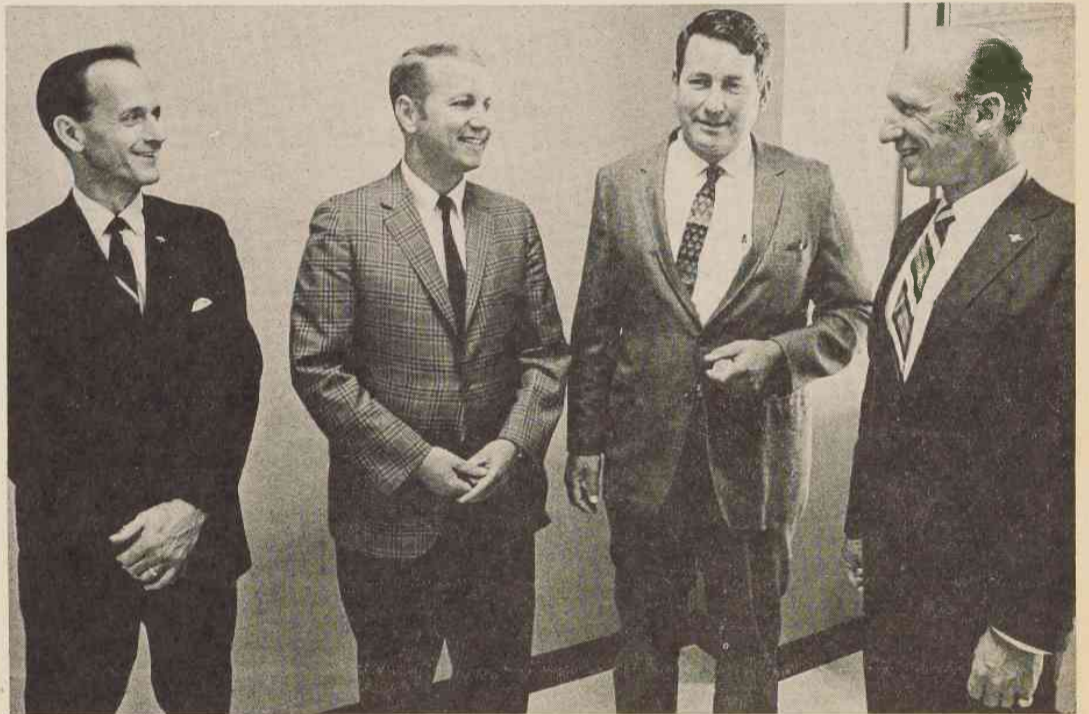
