space available at service charge rates. For travel to Aruba, Curacao and Port au Prince - formerly free on Trans Caribbean - American will charge 50% positive space and 75% space available.

Everything is "GO" for Hilton International in the Caribbean. "GO" means Guest Option, a plan especially designed for airline employees at \$25 per person, double occupancy, for 3 days and 2 nights.
