Colodny challenges employees to be a winner together

"We must keep our employee family secure and feeling good about the organization," USAir Chairman and President Ed Colodny told the more than 1.000 Piedmont employees and guests in his remarks at the service awards banquet.

Colodny recognized Piedmont founder and Chairman Emeritus Tom Davis who was present at the dinner. 
