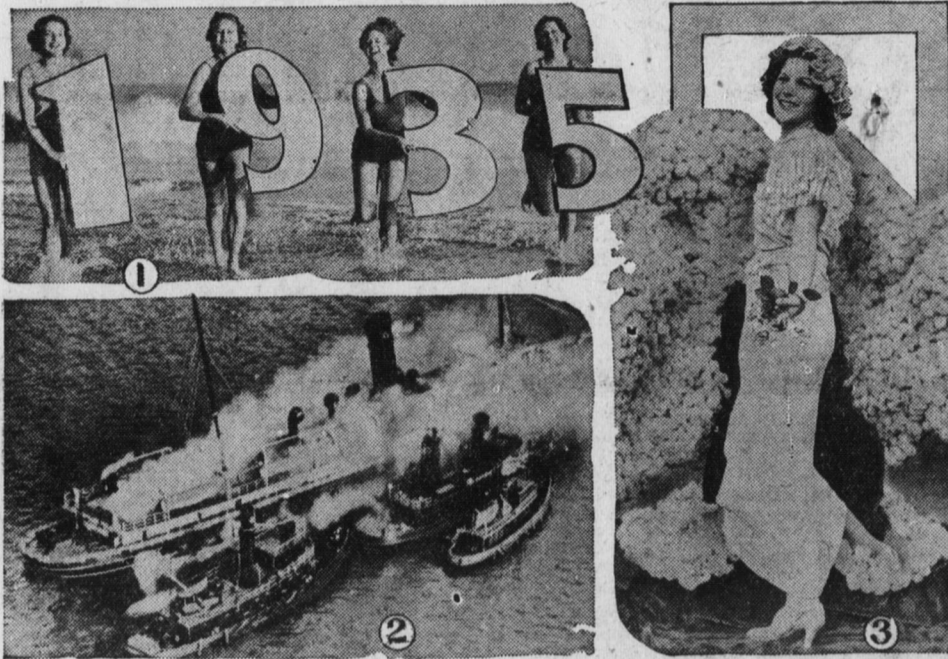


Ethiopian Troops Ready to Meet Italians

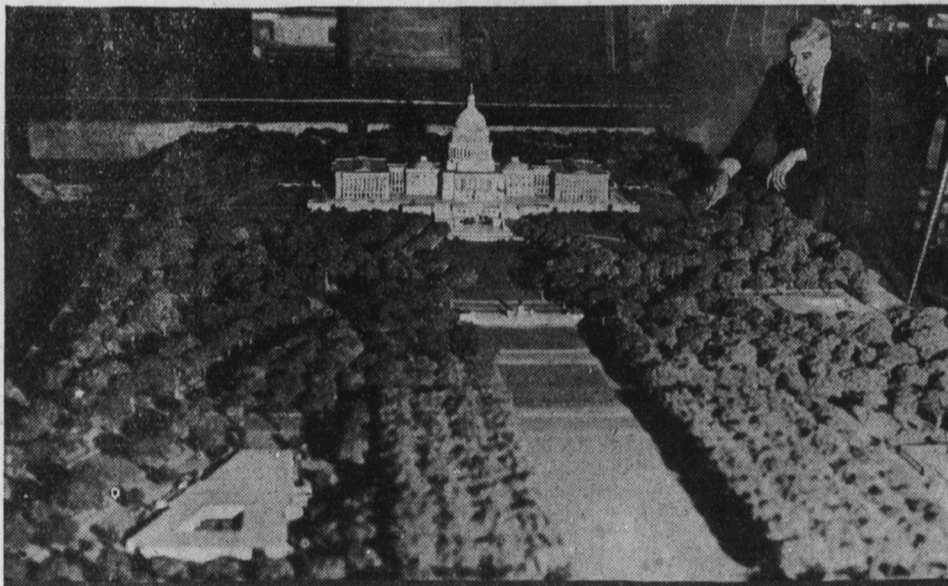

World Has Long Known Dates as Staple Food

"Americans who eat dates chiefly as sweets, dessert, or as components of puddings and cakes, seldom realize that dates have been raised and prized from antiquity as one of the most nourishing, satisfying foods in the world," says a bulletin from the Washington headquarters of the National Geographic society. "Over 4,000 years ago, dates were raised on the banks of the Euphrates. Inhabitants of China, Spain, and Greece, supplement their diet with dates. "Persians, Arabians, and North Africans eat them as we eat potatoes. They are the chief source of wealth and the staple article of food in Arabia. Give a desert nomad a few balled beans, a little olive oil, milk, and some dates, and he considers it a Thanksgiving dinner. In the dry parts of North Africa, dates constitute not only the main meal of the inhabitants, but are consumed by dogs, horses and camels."

GETS ECUADOR POST



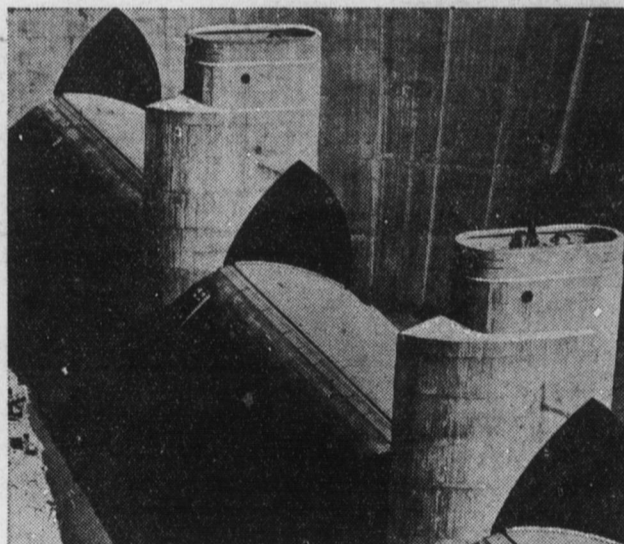

Not a Medieval Fortress



This looks like a part of a fortress of the Middle ages, but in reality it is a view at Boulder dam looking obliquely along the overflow edge of Arizona spillway. The view shows the piers with 16 by 100-foot drum gates in lowered position. These immense steel gates can be raised or lowered to decrease or increase the flow of water over the spillway. Boulder dam is now built to a height of 625 feet above bedrock and will reach its final height of 726 feet late in February, at which time it can begin to store water.
