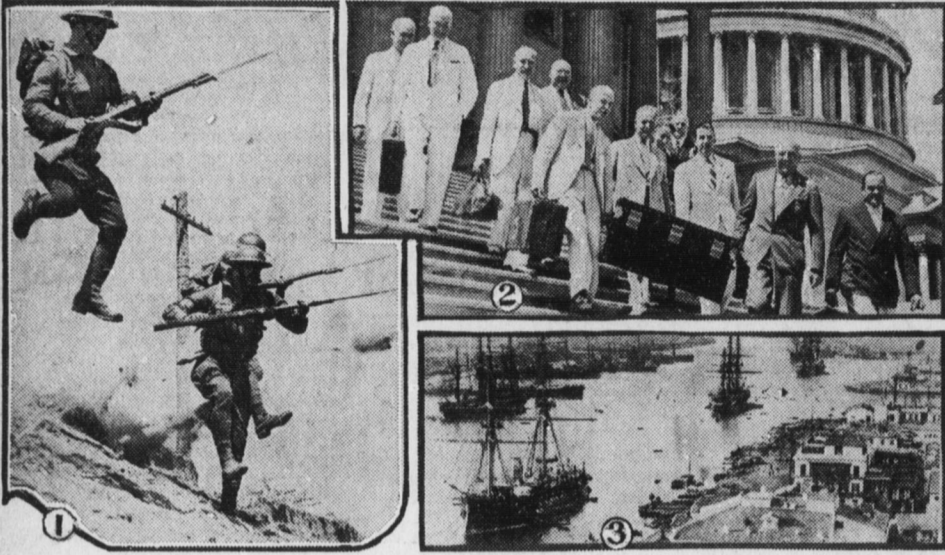

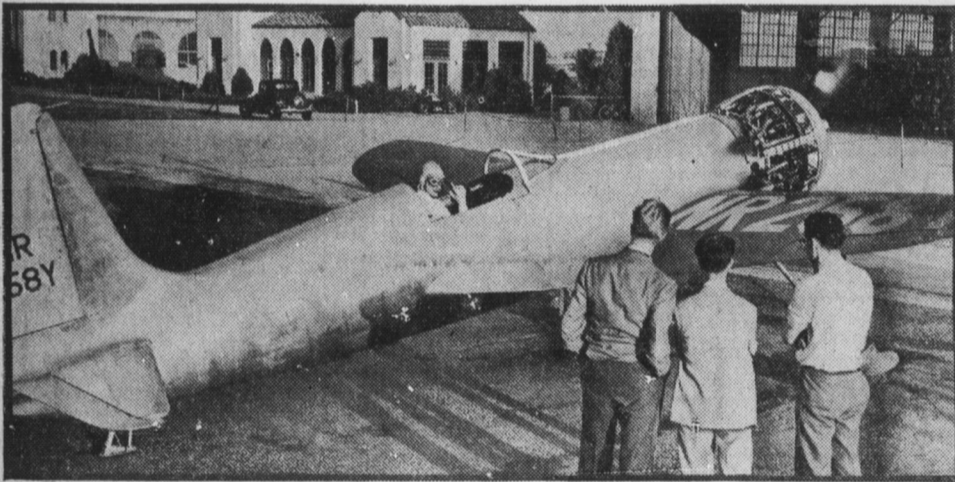

Howard Hughes Tests New Pursuit Plane



Surprising a huge crowd of pilots and airplane manufacturers, Howard Hughes, wealthy sportsman and film producer, permitted his new mystery racing ship to be photographed at Municipal airport, Los Angeles. The low-wing monoplane, powered by a 14-cylinder twin row Wasp engine, has an expected top speed of 365 miles per hour with a cruising speed of 350 miles per hour. Built over a period of two years, the plane is estimated to have cost more than \$100,000. It is equipped with retractable landing gear and a tail skid, and has wing flaps and air brakes.

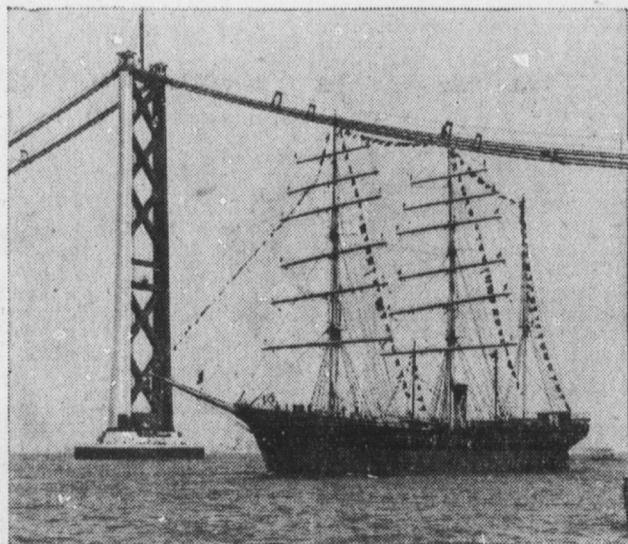
Going Down? Then Holler for Elsie!

Star of Finland Led the Parade



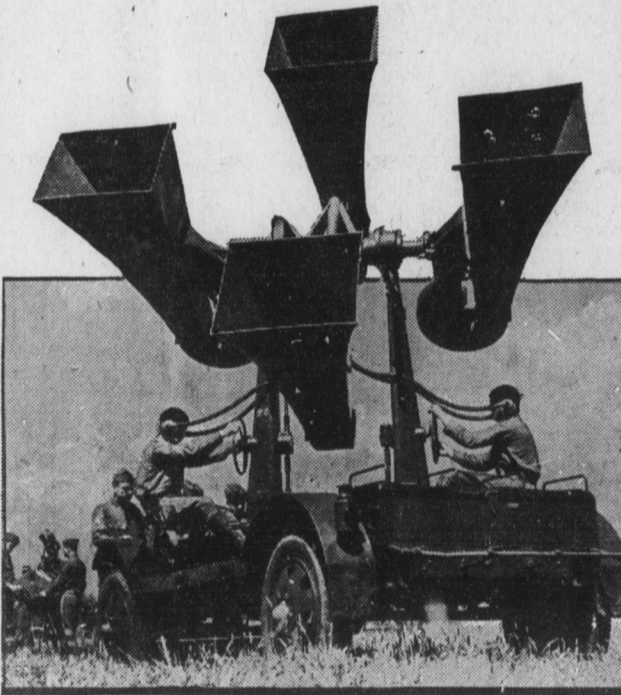

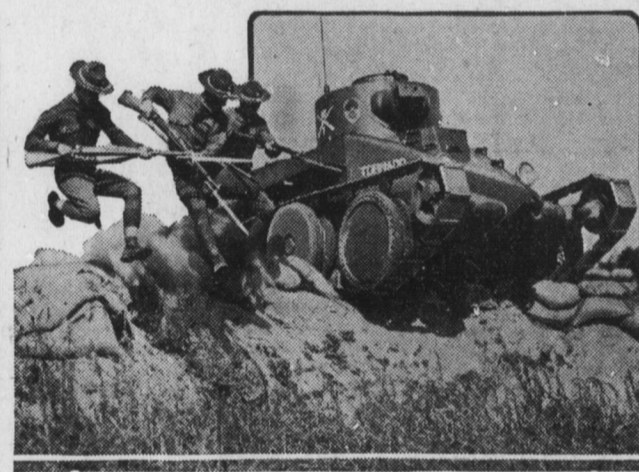

board John G. Winant, former Republican governor of New Hampshire.

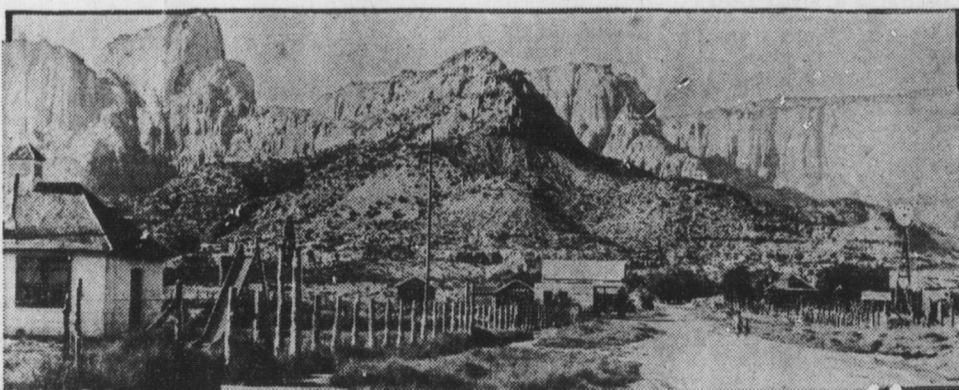
Army Tank Mothers Brood of Bayonets

Indians' Ark Legend Is Still Related in Quebec

The remnants of the Indians in the country surrounding Capes Trinity and Eternity, the high points on the Saginay river, still cling to the ancient belief that the ark or, as they term it, "the big canoe," rested on the top of Cape Trinity, 2,000 feet above the level of the river which skirts its base, and was placed there by a flood which inundated the rest of the earth, destroying all thereon, only the families of worthy Indians, as well as pairs of the various animals and birds being preserved by the Great Manitou, whose guiding hand landed "the big canoe" on the last bit of earth left uncovered by water.

The Indians also have a legend, says a Tadoussac (Quebec) correspondent in the Washington Star, which bears considerable resemblance to the casting of Satan and his rebellious followers out of paradise. According to the Indian tradition, the Great Manitou cast the "fallen angels" over the precipice of Cape Trinity. All met death in the river below with the exception of the leader, who was so strong that the fall of 2,000 feet only crippled him.

As this "angel" gathered strength he became the demon of the river, wrecking canoes, drowning peaceful Indians and wreaking havoc in general.

Mayo, the father of the Indian race, decided to seek and vanquish him in a hand-to-hand encounter. The battle between the two was terrific, Mayo swinging the demon around his head and against the rock of Trinity with such force that the three great gashes in the mountain resulted from the contacts, so the tradition continues. Finally Mayo was victorious, crushing out the life of the demon and thus restoring peace and quiet to the beautiful waters of the Saguenay.

Spar Varnish

Spar varnish, used to protect such surfaces as table tops from spilled liquids, takes its name from the original purpose for which it was made: to protect masts and spars of ships from the ill effects of moisture and salt air. The name "spar varnish" is applied to all long-oil varnishes which are tough, elastic and resistant to moisture.

Belleek Ware

Belleek ware, a very fine kind of pottery of brilliant gloss, resembling porcelain, is made at Belleek, county Donegal, Ireland. At the same time probably the most famous American ware is the Belleek or porcelain of Walter Scott Lenox, called Lenox china. It ranks with the finest of English manufacturers.
