"That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved". Romans 10:9.

Here we have a prerequisite to our salvation, that without which we cannot be saved.

What is it to be saved? It is to confess with our voice, and believe with our hearts the work and life of Jesus Christ His life in the flesh; his atonement in death; his heavenly office as intercessor for us.

By confessing Him before men and believing in our heart we use in our lives His life. In a measure doing the things Jesus did. He made the world better by loving, giving, teaching, being kind. Jesus also condemns evil. There is nothing in His teaching to lead us to condone evil. There is much to encourage us to destroy evil. We need not be brutal in executing a murderer-- we can exact the death penalty without brutality. We can wage a war but there is no need for cruelty. A snake can be killed without an unnecessary torture.

This text is inclusive, but it is also preclusive. It separates the confessor and the believer from the non-believer and the non-confessor. The believer acts, the non-believer doesn't. We can believe. We can confess. We can act on this text to the saving of our souls.
