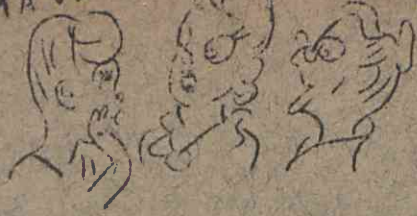


HAVE YOU HEARD?
