MAN FATALLY INJURED AT BRIDAL VEIL FALLS

Harold Hunnicutt, 29, of Seneca, S.C. was fatally injured last Saturday night about midnight when the 1954 Skyliner Ford he was driving alone went out of control on the curve at Bridal Veil Falls and plunged about 75 feet down the mountainside.

He was thrown from the car, his head striking a large rock. He was taken to Highlands Community Hospital where he died of concus-sions and lacerations of the head.

It took workers and a wrecker six hours to haul the wreckage up the mountainside to the highway.
