Ans.: The ownership of the building, land and all equipment is in the name of the Highlands Community Hospital, Inc., a nonprofit corporation. This corporation was set up when the land on which the hospital is built was transferred to us, (Board of Trustees). The corporation, as indicated above, is a non-profit one, chartered under the laws of North Carolina. It has a self perpetuating Board of Trustees, many of whom were named at the time the project was started.
