Major Henry Hornbostel, well known architect and designer of many public buildings and bridges, celebrated his 88th birthday last Monday at the Highlands Country Club where he and Mrs. Hornbostel are spending the month of August.

Mr. and Mrs. Hornbostel have a home in Melbourne Beach, Florida where they have made their residence for the past four years. The Hornbostels went to Melbourne Beach from Harwinton, Conn. and before moving to Harwinton they lived in Pittsburgh, Pa. where the Major was Professor of Architecture at Carnegie Institute of Technology.

Henry Hornbostel was graduated from Columbia University in 1891. During his university career he made a name for him-self on the track team as well as in his study of architecture. After graduation he went to Europe for further study at Ecole des Beaux Arts, in Paris, and travel-(con't. page 7)
