It's easy to believe that any field of endeavor Martin and Lewis aim at would suffer at least a revolution, but when Dean uses Jerry's nightmares for comic book plots--close the windows, they're coming through the doors.

All sorts of goofy, luscious, hilarious and musical things promise to come through the comedy kings' open doors this time: Shirley MacLaine, Dorothy Malone and Eddie Mayehoff; Eva Gabor, Anita Ekberg and George "Foghorn" Winslow; the pick of the country's loveliest models in the costumes the country would pick it it had the opportunity; songs by Brooks and Warren of "That's Amore" fame; spectacular production numbers whose girls will raise the temperature of any theatre; and the zaniest of Martin and Lewis adventures complete with interplanetary rockets, voluptuous foreign spies, and the vulture men.

The story, by director Frank Tashlin, Hal Kanter and Herbert Baker, appears to be out of this world. Jerry, an addict of crime and horror books, is at first a liability to painter Dean as his passion for the sensational reading matter gets them fired from job after job. But when Dean lands a job drawing comic books for goreloving publisher Eddie Mayehoff, Jerry's reading-induced nightmares come in handy--until he discloses secret
