"The revival of the Highlands Community Theatre is one of the finest things that has happened during my two terms as mayor," Highlands mayor V.W. McCall said after the first performance of HARVEY, the opening play of the season.

In participation, audience appreciation and box-office receipts, the Theatre got off to a healthy start. Approximately seventy-five people (and three stage hounds) worked on this first production. This figure indicates, as HCT president, Jack Wilcox says, the opportunity for creative activity that the Theatre offers during the summer.

If applause and after-show comments mean anything, audience reaction was enthusiastic. First-nighters applauded the professional looking stage set...the best he had ever seen on a summer theatre stage a member of Actors' Equity said...and the sustained characterizations of the entire cast.

This year, in addition to paintings, etchings and drawings, there will be included sculpture, ceramics, wood-carving, inlaid wood work, weaving and other hand-crafts.

We were amazed last year to find how many artists we have in Highlands, both professional and "Sunday painters". This year we expect to have even more represented since a number of artists last year had not brought to Highlands any pictures to show. This year we hope they are all prepared; also, we have seen quite a few people sketching in and around Highlands, so we hope to have some local scenes exhibited.

Aside from raising a few dollars to support our Library, the main purpose of the exhibit is to offer all Highlands artists, both professional and amateur, an opportunity to show -- and possibly sell -- their work. Last year our youngest exhibitor was eleven years old; the oldest was well along in her eighties.

The public is assured of an interesting exhibit, well worth the admission charge of 50¢ for adults. Children will be admitted free.
