TOWN BOARD MEET AT CALLED MEETING

At a called meeting Monday night, June 9th, the Town Board discussed the request of the Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors that the Town Board reconsider its action of May 19th when it was decided that the Town Board would not sponsor Hillbilly Day this summer. After discussion of the matter the Town Board decided to stand by its original decision. It was further decided to turn the matter over to the Chamber of Commerce for consideration in regard to sponsoring Hillbilly Day for 1958.
