RAINFALL REPORT

A total rainfall of 30.51 inches has been recorded for the first five months of 1958 at the U.S. weather station located two miles south of Highlands. This is approximately 2.50 inches less than the average amount of precipitation for this five-month period. The monthly rainfall for January through May is as follows: January, 4.17 inches; February, 5.86 inches; March, 5.97 inches; April, 9.55 inches; May, 4.96 inches.

The mean annual rainfall for this

station is 78.74 inches.
