ROTARY WORKS FOR INTERNATIONAL UNDERSTANDING

Rotary clubs in 110 countries and geographical regions throughout the world are united in an endeavor to promote international understanding, good will and peace. That was the message of Gordon L. Butler of Andrews, governor of district 767 of Rotary International, in addressing the Rotary Club of Highlands on Tuesday night, following a conference with local Rotary officers and committee chairman.

In addition to the activities of the more than 9,800 Rotary clubs within their own communities to promote this objective, Mr. Butler explained, Rotary International has awarded grants of more than \$2,600,000 in the past 11 years through its program of student fellowships, which enable outstanding college graduates to study for
