As Americans are supposed to be a statistically-minded people, the Highlands Museum of Natural History herewith offers a set of statistics for the Highlands' residents and visitors. And rather startling statistics they are, too!

1. During June and July of 1959, 785 people have visited the Museum.
2. Visitors to the Museum have come from 20 States, the District of Columbia, and five foreign countries: the Antilles, Denmark, England, Yugoslavia, and Iraq.
