**PARKWAY EXTENSION STUDY
 GIVEN APPROVAL IN HOUSE**

Washington--A 170-mile extension of the Blue Ridge Parkway became a substantial possibility Monday, July 10, with House passage of N. C. Congressman Roy A. Taylor's bill to study the cost and route of a proposed new link of the famous scenic highway.

Rep. Taylor's bill, passed by the House without opposition, would authorize an expenditure of \$35,000 for an intensive study of the feasibility of lengthen-
