The Tenth Annual Summer Music Camp is being held at Western Carolina College, July 30 through August 12. Dr. Richard Renfro, director of the Camp and head of W.C.C.'s music Department, said that several concerts and recitals will be presented by the band, chorus, student, and faculty soloists and ensembles.

Music students from ages 13 to 20 are eligible to attend, with enrollment limited only by available dormitory space and to insure balanced instrumentation.

Macon County has been partially allocated \$83,400 for secondary road improvements during the current fiscal year.

With 417 miles of unpaved secondary roads, the County allocation is based on a standard \$200 per mile for unpaved mileage, according to the State Highway Commission.
