HCH BOARD MEETS

Good news comes to you in regard to our Highlands Hospital. Big things are in the making and we believe you will be most interested in hearing the details.

At the Trustees meeting held Wednesday night, May 3, the Trustees authorized the promotion of a Fund Drive to provide the essential economic security of the hospital as in the past. In addition, the Board went on record approving plans to build the extension of the hospital building. The enlargement of the hospital eventually will lead to accreditation. This will make the Highlands Hospital a more economical and balanced operation in that with the program of staffing the hospital with a General Practitioner and then in addition with a surgeon; the larger number of beds can balance the hospital work, nursing staff, etc. There is
