WATSON BARRATT PASSES

Watson Barratt, theatrical designer, died Friday, July 6, in Columbus Hospital in New York. He was 78 years old and lived in the Royalton Hotel in New York City. He also maintained an estate here in Highlands.

Mr. Barratt's career as art director and scene designer covered more than fifty years and 1,000 productions on and off Broadway, including the original production of "The Student Prince" by Sigmund Romberg in 1924.

As art director, he designed settings, laid out construction and color and supervised stage lighting. Frequently he also selected costumes for productions.

For many years he worked with J.J. Shubert and the late Lee Schubert and was art director for the St. Lewis Municipal Opera, which he joined in 1932. He left in 1934, but returned in 1941 for a ten-
