wards who returned to Atlanta with the Brockways for a visit.

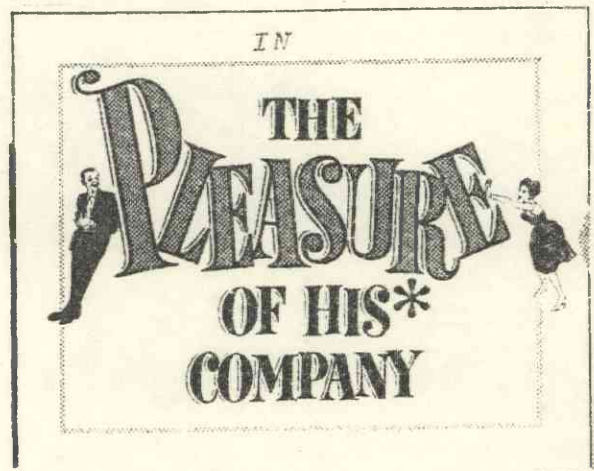
