

year stay.

For a short period in the 1930's, Mr. Barratt became a co-producer with Rufus Phillips and leased the Community Playhouse at Spring Lake, N. J. He staged productions in London and Paris and designed settings for the World's Fair at Brussels, Belgium. His last work was the recent staging of "Brigadoon" at the New York City Center. He worked as a magazine illustrator before turning to the theatre.

Mr. Barratt had studied at the Chase School of Art in New York and at the Howard Pyle Illustration School in Wilmington, Del.

His first commission on Broadway was for "Sinbad" in 1918. He designed subsequent productions of "Blossom Time" in 1921, and all Winter Garden productions from 1918 to 1928; "Artists and Models," 1930; "Hitch Your Wagon" in 1937, and "The Importance of Being Earnest," in 1939.

His wife, Mrs. Louise Bascom Barratt, died in September, 1949, at their home in Highlands.

Mr. Barratt was buried beside his wife in the Highlands Memorial Park. Graveside rites, conducted by Rev. G. Dan McCall, were Monday, July 9. Pallbearers were Mr. Jack Wilcox, Mr. Ted Crunkleton, Mr. George Saussey, and Mr. Frank Cook, Mr. Fred Allen, and Mr. Taft Henry.

Mr. Barratt was interested in the Highlands Community Theatre, and had contributed to its growth. Some people sent contributions to the Watson Barratt Memorial Fund rather than sending flowers.
