the opera " Orfeo ed Euridice" and is the lament Orfeo sings after Euridice's death. Air De Lia from L'Enfant Prodigue is part of Debussy's early cantata based on the story of the prodigal son.

Miss Wolff will also sing two arias sung by the love-struck page Cherubino in Mozart's "The Marriage of Figaro." Non So Piu Cosa comes from the first act when Cherubino sings in praise of his secret beloved, the Countess. The delightful aria, "Voi, Che Sapeta," comes from the second act.

Edward Vito will play Concertstruck for Harp and Orchestra, Opus 39, by Pierne and the orchestra will close with Tschai-kovsky's Symphony No. 4, F Minor, Opus 36.

Miss Wolff began her musical career as a trumpeter in the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra; then conductor Henry Sopkin discovered her lovely--and powerful--mezzo soprano voice. In 1952, she won the Philadelphia Orchestra Youth Contest and Eugene Ormandy immediately engaged her as a soloist.

She has sung numerous engagements with the Philadelphia Orchestra and other leading orchestras and has played starring roles with the New York City Opera Com-

pany, the Washington (D.C.) Opera Society and the NBC TV Opera Theatre.

Mr. Vito, who has also done much composing and arranging, has played all over the world. He received an award as "musician of the year" from the University of the Philippines in 1958.

The harp sounds on all Toscanini's records with NBC Symphony are Vito's. He was with the famous conductor in 1950 when the NBC group made this nation's most outstanding music tour. He has cut records for almost every major record company.

But, like so many other great musical artists, both Miss Wolff and Mr. Vito are wholesome human beings. Their warm feelings for the Brevard Music Center has endeared them to the hearts of the Southland's music lovers--and especially to the youngsters.
