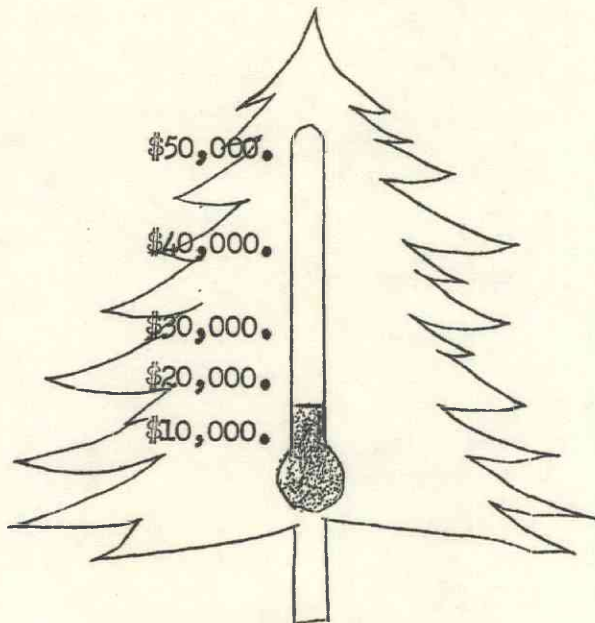

"X-15"

The true star of "X-15," which opens Saturday, July 21 at the GALAX THEATRE, through United Artists release, is the world's first pilot-controlled space vehicle itself: the sleek, swift, black and bold X-15.

"X-15" tells the headline-hot story of the project to put America's manned rocket plane 100 miles above the earth at speeds of 4,000 miles per hour! It was made with the full cooperation of The National Aeronautics and Space Administration, The Department of Defense, The Air Force, Navy, and North American Aviation, Inc., under Frank Sinatra's E-C Production Banner.

David McLean, Charles Bronson, James Gregory and Mary Tyler Moore were recruited from their busy television schedules to play the principal roles in "X-15," much of which was photographed at Edwards Air Force Base, near Lancaster, California, where the X-15 Air Force Flight Test Center is located. Because of the government's cooperation, moviegoers will actually see astonishing footage never before shown to the general public, taken during tests of the real X-15 in the fringes of outer space. They will also see f-100 jet fighters, used as "chase" planes, the B-52 "mother ship" from which the X-15 is launched in flight, and scores of thrilling, factual scenes calculated to instruct as well as to entertain, in this drama of science fact.

The start of the picture was hailed in Congress by Representative James C. Corman, Californian on the Science and Astronautics Committee, who stated that the government cooperation would "...assure that this picture will be accurate and will put this entire area of our defense into its proper perspective."
