At a meeting held Monday night the Town of Highlands adopted an official budget for the 1962-1963 fiscal year. Upon the third reading a \$163,906 budget was adopted as sufficient to meet the Town's needs.

The Board voted to give money to the Highlands Community Hospital, Highlands Chamber of Commerce, Hudson Library, and Highlands Memorial Park for the amount allocated for the fiscal year, which is as follows: Hospital and Chamber of Commerce \$500 each; Library and Cemetery \$250 each.

The Town purchased a utility body from the Murphy Body Distributors, Inc. for the pick-up truck recently bought, and a power unit for pumps at Rattlesnake and Houston Stations to be used as extra motors. The bid from Western North Carolina Paving Company for paving of the Town streets was accepted.




