BREVARD CONCERTS JULY 20-22

Leonard Pennario, recently returned from a triumphant tour of Europe, will make two solo appearances at the Brevard Music Center this week-end.

The celebrated pianist, among the nation's top five in classical record sales, will play Bartok's Piano Concerto No. 3 Friday evening and Schumann's Piano Concerto in A Minor Sunday afternoon.

A professional concertist since he was 12 and now in his middle thirties, Pennario has played with most of America's major symphonies, including the New York Philharmonic, the Boston Symphony, Philadelphia, Chicago, and St. Louis. In the South He has played with the Atlanta Symphony, New Orleans, Dallas, and Houston.

The Music Center concert week-end also provide an opportunity for another fine young artist under a grant of the Atlanta Music Club in honor of Maestro Marvin McDonald. She is Penny Ambrose, 16-year old native of Connecticut, who played "Ave Maria" on the Bell Telephone TV program when she was only 14. Miss Ambrose will play Bruch's Violin Concerto (CON'D PAGE 16)
