

BREVARD CONCERTS JULY 27-29

With representatives from dozens of Music Clubs in the audience, next week-end's concert schedule at the Brevard Music Center will highlight National Federation of the Music Club award winners.

Friday evening's soloist will be 13year old Joan Weiner, winner of the 1962 Federation's Stillman Kelly Sholarship Award of \$1,000. The 9th grader from Lake Bancroft, Va., will play Tschaikovsky's Piano Concerto No. 1, B Flat Minor.

A field group from Ohio State University registered at the Station last week. Members were: Steve Tilley, David Demis, and John Jenkinson. This group was collecting salamanders.


EPISCOPAL EVENTS


